

Rabies Clinic: Dr. Tyson Benson of the Homestead Large Animal Clinic will be holding a rabies clinic at the town offices on Saturday October 15th. between 10:00 AM and 1:00 PM.

The cost for shots is \$10.00 each and all certificates are good for one (1) year unless proof of a prior vaccination is provided. With proof of a prior vaccination you will receive a three (3) year certificate. Dogs must be on a leash and cats must be in carriers or secured.
